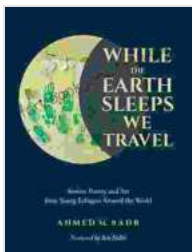

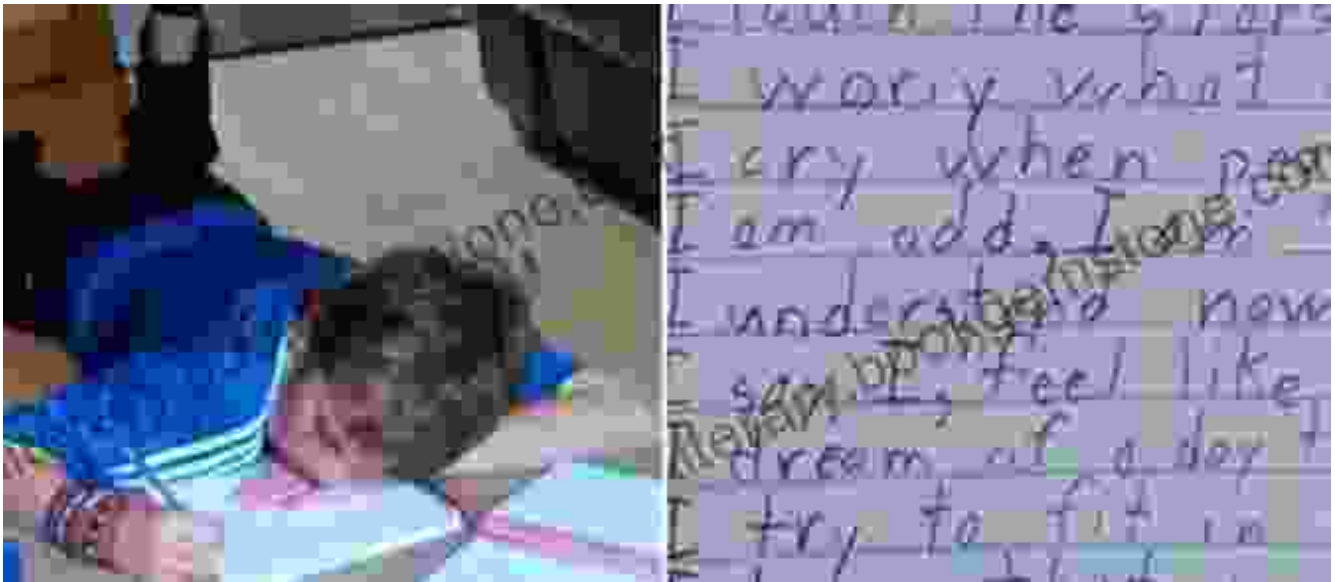

These are just a few of the many stories of young refugees around the world. They are all unique, but they share a common goal: to heal from their trauma and to build a better future for themselves and their families.

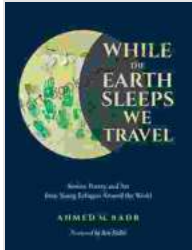
We can all learn from their stories. They remind us of the importance of compassion, empathy, and resilience. They also remind us that even in the darkest of times, there is always hope.
